

### Theme: "Assumption"

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven reveals that what God begins, he brings to completion. In choosing her from the beginning to be the Mother of the Saviour, the Lord prepared her through the Immaculate Conception, which protected her from original sin. Throughout her life, grace continued to expand and flower within her, giving her strength to stand by Jesus on the cross, epitomized by the 'pieta'; Mary holding the body of her son in her arms on Calvary. As her own time on earth was coming to an end, she was preserved from corruption of the tomb and enjoys already a bodily participation in the glory of Christ in heaven. From there, she prays for us – that grace may come to perfection in us, and that we may share in her glory with Jesus.

### Reflection: 'Our Lady Is In Heaven'

'We do not know where or what or how heaven is, but this we know, and it is very nearly all that we know about heaven; In heaven Our Lady is with God. Our Lady's body is there, and the Body of Christ is there, and our Lady's soul and the soul of Christ and his divinity. We can realise this only in so far as we realise it through its effect upon the world. There, before God, is humanity – but innocent humanity in all its primal loneliness, humanity with which the Spirit of God is in love'.

Let us pray, - Having partaken of this heavenly table, we beseech your mercy, Lord our God, that we who honour the Assumption of the Mother of God, may be freed from every threat of harm. Through Christ Our Lord, AMEN

#### "Our Churches are OPEN!"

It is heartening to see churches now allowed to accommodate those who come to Mass and not having to book beforehand. Coming to Mass is central to our lives as Catholic Christian people of God. The Virtual World of the internet is not the same as being at Mass; it is a helpful substitute for those who are confined to their homes. If parents can take their children shopping to Lidl or the Coop then how much better and life giving is it to bring them to Mass. The Safeguards remain – As there is no longer a requirement to book for mass, Eventbrite will cease operating at this time. We still require your details though, for track and trace purposes. Please provide your name and contact telephone number on arrival at the church to the welcome ministers. There are also check in Scotland posters with a QR code on the outside of the church, and in the porch area, for those that wish to use it. *The QR code is scanned using the camera facility on a smart phone, which takes you to an online form to complete. (Name, contact number, and how many persons are in your group). If you don't have a smart phone, you can download an app for QR code reading. Alternatively, you can check in by visiting [checkin.scot/37170150K](https://checkin.scot/37170150K) via your internet browser.* If you would like to use the QR code, but not sure how to, please ask a welcome minister who will be happy to assist. If someone tests positive for COVID-19 after visiting the Church, Check In Scotland works with NHS Scotland's Test and Protect to alert anyone who may have been a close contact of the person. Masks and sanitising to continue. We are very grateful for the welcomers, cleaners and Mass bookers for all their dedication and committed work.



#### Streaming of Masses Online

To give the Zoom Hosts a break over the summer holidays we reduced the Zooming of Masses to 3 times a week. In order to make online transmission less of a workload; we are moving now to 'YouTube' transmission. It will begin with a period of consultation and discernment on Sunday 17 October this year. Sr Anna Marie McGuan RSM has been asked to be the Archdiocese's lead delegate in the national synodal process and will be assisted by Fr John Deighan (Lennoxton, Milton & Torrance). An announcement will be made soon on how that process will take shape in our Archdiocese.

### The Teachings of the Church

#### 'The duties of Married Life'

'Marriage, to be sure, is freely contracted: there must be no coercion. But once a man and a woman – in complete freedom – have made this contract, the union assumes the character of an institution at once religious and civil. By their union in marriage, each of the parties confers a sacrament on each other; they are themselves the ministers whom Our Blessed Lord employs for the communication of that sacramental grace of which He is the author'. ### Saints Days this week

**Friday 20<sup>th</sup> August – St Bernard of Clairvaux** – 12<sup>th</sup> Century charismatic monastic figure who reformed monastery life in the Cistercian Order and drew many followers to the cloisters of Citeaux and Clairvaux. His writings reveal a solid grasp of biblical studies, spiritual theology and philosophy.

**Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> August – St Pius X** – Pope of the Church just over a century ago. Came from humble peasant origin. Rose to be Cardinal Patriarch of Venice before being elected Pope in 1903. With his pastoral and liturgical gifts sought to engage the faithful in more frequent attendance at Mass and more frequent Holy Communion. Also, took on the Modernist heresy to protect the unity of the church.
