

Theme: "The Holy Spirit"

Pentecost Sunday, fifty days after Easter Sunday, marks the time when, as promised by Jesus, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit would come upon them in a definitive way and empower them to go out to build the Church on earth. The first reading from Acts gives us the historical context in which this experience took place, the sights, the sounds and the dramatic consequences that prevailed on these apostles and disciples of Jesus. It is made clear to them and us, that they are no longer doing their own work but rather are working in the name of the Lord. The universality of the mission is manifested in the speaking of many foreign languages. There is no uncertainty in the command of Jesus to go out into the world, refute evil, and baptise people of all nations in my name through the Holy Spirit.

Reflection: 'Poverty of Spirit' – Fr Jack Dalrymple

"Poverty of spirit can be seen as a condition of progress in prayer, something to be achieved in order that growth should come in prayer. It can also, however, be seen as a fruit of progress in prayer, something that happens to us as a sign that we have grown in contemplation. Put simply, what happens is that as through prayer, God comes to be seen as the Absolute, the 'One Thing Necessary' in our life. Everything else comes to be seen as relative. The created world is recognised as good, created as it is by God but it is viewed now in the light of God. It is seen as beautiful and desirable but relative and provisional. This does not take away from its importance, rather does it enhance it ... God has become more important to us. Progress in prayer has brought a certain detachment from material things".

Pentecost Sunday – The Birthday of the Church

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, let us be conscious of our spiritual ancestors who brought Christianity to these West Lothian lands over one thousand years ago. Churches like Ecclesmachan, Abercorn and 'Old St Nicholas' in Uphall, are a legacy of the Catholic Christian missionaries from the 9th century or earlier. 1560 saw the Catholic Church suppressed but thankfully, through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are encouraged to work towards Christian unity, in company with other Christian denominations. As Jesus said in St John's Gospel, "May they all be one, as you are in me and I am in you".

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

This week the local presbyterian churches, along with ourselves, are joining together in worship for the 'Week of Prayer for Christian Unity'. The theme this year is 'I saw His Star Rising in the East'. This in some ways is a call for Christians of the 'East' and the 'West' throughout the world to celebrate the incarnate God in Jesus Christ. We have local services planned as follows:

Sunday 5th June 6.30pm – Pentecost Service in 'St Nicholas Old' (The North Church, Uphall).

All the local clergy will be taking part. Hosted by Rev Hanneke van Heusen. Please come along. During the course of the next four days, the local churches will take turns to host a lunchtime service at 12 noon, followed at 12.30pm with a cup of tea/coffee and a bite to eat. Sacraments

Primary 4 – First Holy Communion

Broxburn: The St John Cantius and St Nicholas First Communions went very well last weekend. I think all the children and their families found it a very memorable and positive experience.

Winchburgh: The First Holy Communions in St Philomena's, Winchburgh, take place on **Saturday 4th June at 11am. Please note NO 9.30am Mass that day.** The 12 children will be in our thoughts and prayers. 15 guests per child are permitted, with each child having a row, and remaining guests filling up pews behind.

The Mass of Thanksgiving is Sunday 5th June at 11.30am, when the children will wear their outfits again and take part in the bidding prayers, offertory and the post communion song. They will get their certificates and have a First Communion breakfast in the hall afterwards. We pray it goes well.

NB. Parents, please try to keep the number of cars to a minimum. There is limited parking and we don't wish to upset the neighbours.

The Teaching of the Catechism – Para 47 – 'Who is the Holy Spirit?'

It is the Holy Spirit who makes me a dwelling place of God'.

Saints Days this Week

Monday 6th June – Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church: Pope Francis added this to the Roman Calendar in 2018, to remind all Christ's disciples that if they want to grow and be filled with the love of God, it is necessary to plant their lives firmly in 3 great realities; the Cross, the Eucharist and the Mother of God.

Thursday 9th June – St Columba – Feast: Abbot born of royal blood in Ireland. 563AD left for Iona and founded a monastery from which the faith spread to the Highlands and Islands of Scotland.

Saturday 11th June – St Barnabas - Martyr: A Levite of Cypriot origin. Helped St Paul to work well with the apostles. Centred at Antioch. Martyred at Salamis in 61AD.
